# **Understanding Fellowship**

The word, "fellowship," is found 8 times in the ESV New Testament. This word "fellowship," according to 'The Student Bible Dictionary' is defined as "*The family feeling & partnership between Christians. Translates the Greek word "koinonia." Association, close relationship, participation with, sharing. You experience fellowship when you share life events, commitment, trust, & understanding with other Christians. Fellowship expresses like-mindedness, communicates acceptance, helps believers grow, encourages the sharing of the work of the church, & includes bad times as well as good. The Bible points out the dangers of fellowship with wrongdoers, with unbelievers, & with demons. The person who lives in sin does not live in fellowship with God.*" Although there are some minor things incorrect with this particular definition, it is how this definition is applied that contributes to the misunderstanding in religion today. The rest of this article will clarify the inconsistencies. Here are some facts about fellowship...

#### Fellowship Is Between Individuals & Not Congregations

In speaking with other Christians, have we ever been asked the question, "Who are you in fellowship with?" In other words, which congregations in the area does Wildercroft associate with? This question assumes that fellowship is something that can take place between congregations. However, it is not. Fellowship is a word, when used Biblically, only addresses the spiritual relationship between man/man & man/divine.

As Christians, we have fellowship with God. In *1 John 1:3*, the Bible reads, "*That which we have seen and heard we proclaim also to you, so that you too may have fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father and with his Son Jesus Christ.*" This Scripture also teaches that we have fellowship with Jesus & so do many others (*1 Corinthians 1:9* & *1 John 1:6*). As Christians, we have fellowship with the Holy Spirit. In *2 Corinthians 13:14*, the Bible reads, "*The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ and the love of God and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit be with you all.*" In addition to having fellowship with God the Father, God the Son, & God the Holy Ghost, we have fellowship with one another, as in other faithful Christians. In *1 John 1:7*, the Bible reads, "*But if we walk in the light, as he is* 

*in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin"* (*1 John 1:3* & *Galatians 2:9*).

#### Fellowship Requires Devotion

In *Acts 2:42*, the Bible reads, "*And they devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.*" The question is, "Devotion to whom?" It is devotion to the Divine & devotion to our brethren. Our devotion to the Divine is limited to living according to His will. Our devotion to our brethren is limited only to those among us who are presently in fellowship with God. When we learn & understand this principle from the very beginning, then we will never find ourselves unequally yoked, in partnership with, in accord with, sharing with, &/or in agreement with unbelievers & wayward brethren (*2 Corinthians 6:14-16*).

#### <u>Fellowship Is Spiritual & Not Social/Recreational (Romans</u> <u>14:17)</u>

This is one fact that is hard for many in the Lord's church to understand simply because we are spiritual beings residing in physical bodies. Due to these bodies, all of our interaction is physical & sometimes, involves social & recreational activities. Therefore, we merge the two together & believe that fellowship is "anything" Christians do together. This is simply not true. According to Scripture, fellowship is when Christians come together to partake of the Lord's Supper & not a common meal (1 Corinthians 10:16). Fellowship is when benevolence is provided for needy saints & not those who are outside of the body of Christ i.e. the community, hospitals, & orphanages (Romans 15:26, 2 Corinthians 8:4, & 2 *Corinthians 9:13*). Fellowship is when Christians greet one another (2 Corinthians 13:13). Fellowship is when truth is share among believers (Ephesians 3:9 & Philemon 1:6). Fellowship is when Christians financially support the preaching of the gospel (*Philippians 1:5*). Fellowship is sharing & sacrifice among believers (Hebrews 13:16). If we call something "fellowship," then it is fellowship at all times & not when we want it to be. These acts are considered fellowship because it carries out the spiritual work of Christ on Earth & it brings glory to our God in Heaven.
