Thanksgiving In The Midst Of The Storm



Acts 27:35 - And when he had said these things, he took bread, and giving thanks to God in the presence of all he broke it and began to eat.

We often face many storms in life. But even though we face many storms, we can still have a spirit of thanksgiving in our hearts in the midst of

the storm. Let us use our text as an example of how we can always maintain a spirit of thanksgiving in our lives.

The Reality Of Life's Storms

The storm was unexpected. In **Acts 27:13-14**, the Bible reads, "And when the south wind blew softly, supposing that they had obtained their purpose, loosing thence, they sailed close by Crete. But not long after there arose against it a tempestuous wind, called Euroclydon." The storm was unmanageable. In Acts 27:15, the Bible reads, "And when the ship was caught, & could not bear up into the wind, we let her drive." The storm was unrelenting. In Acts 27:20, the Bible reads, "And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, & no small tempest lay on us, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away." In life, we will be faced with situations which are unexpected, unmanageable, & unrelenting. We are not exempt from suffering, bad times, & pain, but with God on our side we can overcome every typhoon, tsunami, hurricane, & tropical storm. The storm may be bigger than us, but greater is He that is in us than any situation brought against us (1 John 4:4).

In The Midst Of The Storm, We Must Still Trust God

The passengers were consumed with fear & lost all hope. In Acts 27:20, the Bible reads, "And when neither sun nor stars in many days appeared, & no small tempest lay on us, all hope that we should be saved was then taken away." Nevertheless, in the midst of it all, Paul still had a relationship with the Father. In Acts 27:23-24, the Bible reads, "For there stood by me this

night the angel of God, whose I am, & whom I serve, Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: &, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee." Not only did Paul have a relationship with God, but he was confident in his faith. In Acts 27:25, the Bible reads, "Wherefore, sirs, be of good cheer: for I believe God, that it shall be even as it was told me." At the first sign of trouble, people around us may be consumed with fear. At the arrival of the storm, our friends & family may lose all hope. However, if we just keep trusting in God, cast out fear, & hold on to the hope we have in Christ Jesus, then we know it is only a matter of time our Savior will stand up, say "Peace, Be Still," & calm will take the place of every high wave & boisterous wind against us (Mark 4:39).

<u>Regardless Of The Situation, We Must Have Thanksgiving In</u> The Midst Of The Storm

Like Paul, we must be thankful for the provision of food during the storm. In Acts 27:35, the Bible reads, "And when he had thus spoken, he took bread, & gave thanks to God in presence of them all: & when he had broken it, he began to eat." Like Paul, we must be thankful for the presence & the protection of the Father during the storm. In Acts 27:23 & Acts 27:34, the Bible reads, "For there stood by me this night the angel of God, whose I am, & whom I serve. Wherefore I pray you to take some meat: for this is for your health: for there shall not an hair fall from the head of any of you." Like Paul, we must be thankful for the promise of a future beyond the storm. In Acts 27:24, the Bible reads, "Saying, Fear not, Paul; thou must be brought before Caesar: &, lo, God hath given thee all them that sail with thee." Are we aware as to why we are to remain in the ship regardless? It is because the ship we are on is called "Salvation" & Jesus is the captain of it. Listen to your Bible! In Hebrews 2:10, the Bible reads, "For it became him, for whom are all things, & by whom are all things, in bringing many sons unto glory, to make the captain of their salvation perfect through sufferings." Provisions, protection, & promises have been made by Him to assure our deliverance out of this storm & for this, we must be thankful!
